The Hebrew Month of Mar (Bitter) Cheshvan Has Arrived – Therefore Just Get Busy. Not Bitter!

The Hebrew month of Mar (bitter) Cheshvan officially arrived on our Jewish calendar on Oct. 26, 2022. Why is this referred to as a “bitter” month? In this case, the term was invented by the rabbis who projected, as it were, actual “feelings” onto the month for one reason – this is a month where there are no Jewish holidays, and they felt that the month itself was jealous regarding the other months, which have sometimes more than one holiday in it, and therefore felt “bitter” or angry about it!

Now while it’s certainly true that there is a tremendous amount of energy devoted to the other holidays, in terms of anticipation, preparation – both spiritually and physically in terms of cooking, and so much other preparation – followed by the actual observance of the holidays and festivals themselves—the fact is, that from time to time we need breaks and calmness in order to regroup and re-stabilize. Often such a calming time can itself be very healthy and rejuvenating in itself!

Therefore, I have the “perfect” rabbinic suggestion under the circumstances: consciously take a few days off solely for the purpose of feeling “grounded and stabilized” again after our intense and moving shared holidays, and then stay busy by joining a committee of Temple Torat Yisrael, such as programming or membership, or sign up for one of our upcoming classes, or start coming regularly to some of our ongoing services. By keeping “busy”, there shouldn’t be as much time left to be “bitter” in Cheshvan, and you’ll know that you’re constantly geared towards helping others and strengthening our community!

Torat Yisrael's Cohen School

The whirlwind of Fall holidays has passed, and the Cohen school is full speed ahead. One of the ways that we explored the holiday of Sukkot was by making sukkah decorations. The K/1 class and the 4/5 class combined to make a beautiful "Bruchim Habayim" sign to hang at the entrance of the temple sukkah. This sign is now in the school wing so feel free to check it out. The 2/3 class and the 6/7 class worked together to create lovely decorated CD's that shone in the sunlight. We love creating opportunities for our older students to mentor the younger classes and we are always so impressed with the connections they make with each other!

The students also participated in a Sukkot program on the 16th, with Rabbi Barnett, by hanging the decorations in the sukkah, shaking the lulav and etrog and reciting the appropriate blessings. The students even had a special brownie treat in the sukkah. A great time was had by all!

Our Sprouts program that was held on October 16th, focused on the holiday of Sukkot. Children, ages 3-5 and their guardians joined Dori and Rabbi Barnett to explore the traditions of the holidays. Children played in the pop-up tent sukkah, colored Sukkot pictures, listened to two silly Sukkot stories, sang songs and created decorations to hang in the sukkah. They also had the opportunity to shake the lulav and etrog and share a snack with each other in the sukkah. The Sprouts program is \$12 per session/\$80 for 8 sessions. The Sprouts program meets once a month from October- May. The next Sprouts, on November 13th, will be led by Rabbi David Barnett and Leah Ross-Coke and will focus on a Jewish version of Thanksgiving. We hope to see you there!

We have begun our weekly all school Tefillah program. On October 2nd, we had our first weekly Tefillah prayer program led by Rabbi Barnett. It was great to finally be all together in the main sanctuary to pray. On October 23rd, students had the opportunity to lead prayers from the bimah, talk about what they learned in the classrooms and dance around with instruments. We look forward to many more prayer practice opportunities with our teachers and Dori leading this hands-on program.

On October 30th, the entire school will be making rainbow challah with Shoshana Laufer of West Bay Chabad, to explore the parashat Noach. Students will be learning about Noah in their classrooms prior to baking. The rainbow challah will symbolize the rainbow that G-d sent to the Jewish people as a covenant that the earth would never be destroyed by water again. We are happy to announce that this challah program will be sponsored by Shalom Memorial Chapel. We are so grateful for their continuous support of programs at the Cohen School.

Hebrew Bootcamp is up and running this Fall. We have 8 students and it is taught by Andrea Allgood and Dori. This Hebrew program meets on Tuesdays from 4:30-5:30 and costs an additional \$100. We have noticed a drastic increase in Hebrew skills in our students that attend this extra hour of learning.
